## Music For All Children

Nearly half of Troy high school students elect music classes and activities. The 960 students registered at the high school have a wide offering of instrumental and vocal experiences from which to choose. There are two bands of 130 and an orchestra of 70. There are classes in theory and appreciation; boys' choruses, girls' choruses, and numerous instrumental ensembles; a training choir of 100 and an a capella choir of 130 voices from which 37 are selected for the Trojans.

All 3,000 elementary school children participate in music. From kindergarten through eighth grade, opportunities are given for experience in both instrumental and vocal classes.

The entire music program of the Troy, Ohio, public schools is supervised and coordinated by Mr. Chas. E. West. He also directs the Trojans. Mr. West has a B.S. in music education from Miami University and an M.A. from Ohio State University. He has taken special work at the Christiansen Choir School and the University of Denver.

Mr. Charles Secoy is principal of the high school and Mr. Glenn B. Jeffers is superintendent of schools.
