While lowering John on the rope, it made a loud rubbing noise on the aluminum windows. All of a sudden, Mr. Vesper appeared in the room. It seemed like 10 minutes that we stopped our activities and stared at each other. Finally, Mr. Vesper said to finish what we were doing and leave.

About 10 years later, I spoke with him about the prank. He said that he was between a rock and a hard spot. He thought it was funny, but he was also supposed to maintain control as a teacher. What a great guy!!
