II. Scholarship

In scholarship, my year was devoted to obtaining funding and reviewing the scholarly work of others. I did not reach my goal in publication, though I have three papers in preparation right now for publication in 1996. Two of these papers will be co-authored with students.

III. Service

My service was devoted to the duties of department chair and Status Committee. These I feel were done adequately.

Review of Goals for 1993

1. Publish a paper on the DARPA grant activities.

This paper, though drafted, has not been submitted for publication yet. I intend to split it into two papers and submit both for publication next year.

2. Develop a plan for a new textbook writing project.

The Schaum's Interactive project is this plan. In addition, I am considering the development of a textbook for an introductory computer science course using Stegink's graphics approach.

3. Successfully develop and implement CSCI 225, Software Design and Implementation.

This course has now been successfully offered for two semesters and has become a key part of the department's curriculum.

Goals for 1995

1. Publish two papers based on DARPA activities and one paper based on Air Force grant activities.

2. Continue planning for Schaum's Interactive project.

3. Recruit new faculty member for department and facilitate her/his successful beginning at the college.
